The classes we race are 1/10th scale electric & gas (I.C.), please look at our website (www.aldershotmodelcarclub.net) for more information. The rules for racing can be found on the BRCA website (www.brca.org). For club racing we don't strictly enforce BRCA rules but abide by them as best we can. As long as no purposeful cheating is apparent you will be able to race. This is a hobby and we here to have fun!

As a member of the club you agree to abide by these rules. Failure to do so may result in your membership being revoked.

- 1) Foul, abusive or threatening behaviour anywhere within the site is not tolerated and you will be asked to leave immediately. Your club membership may also be revoked.
- 2) You are responsible for your litter, please pick up your rubbish and leave the site clean and tidy.
- 3) Do not clean your car body shell in the sink in the toilet block. Please leave the toilet facilities clean and tidy.
- 4) All drivers must have a BRCA licence in order to drive on ANY day (practise or race meetings).
- 5) Driving model cars within the car parking/pitting area is strictly prohibited.
- 6) Entry to the track is via the pit gate only. Jumping fences is strictly prohibited.
- 7) No food, drink or mobile phones are to be taken trackside.
- 8) You must check that others are not already using your frequency before switching on your transmitter. On race days this can be done by looking at the heat listing. On practice days please ask others already at the track – don't assume you are the only person using your frequency.
- 9) Model car driving is potentially dangerous. Drivers must pay particular attention to the presence of marshals. When marshalling you must consider your safety, do not step on to the track without checking it is safe to do so first. Drivers of gas cars (I.C.) must not be "on the throttle" when marshals are handling the car, as a marshal you do not have to retrieve a car that is being revved violently by a frustrated driver. Safety is paramount.
- 10) If when driving you either crash or have a problem that results in the car being situated on the track you must shout out to warn other drivers eg. "dead car on the straight".
- 11) During qualifying, if a car catches you up they are obviously faster than you and you must move over and allow them to pass. You are only racing against each other during the final. Any persistent bad driving, T-boning etc. may result in disqualification.
- 12) **Practise: Only members are allowed to use the track for practise.** Electric – every day 10am to 6pm. (Thursdays 12 midday start). Gas/IC – every day 1pm to 4pm. The track may be closed if necessary for maintenance or during event at the Kiln.

The committee takes very seriously any breach of these rules
